> Many possibilities. However, this is a newsgroup about DAP (Data Access  
> Pages) and SQL-Server and has nothing to do with the problem of dividing  
> an Access database between a backend and a frontend.  
>  
> You should ask your question in a more appropriate newsgroup; where they  
> will probably tell you to split your databases into a backend and a  
> frontend and make sure that each user has its own personal copies of the  
> frontends; otherwise corruption of the compiled modules may occurs if one  
> of these users doesn't have the same exact configuration for Windows  
> (versions and services packs) as the other ones.  
>  
> Don't forget to take a look at the /decompile switch.
