> You can increase line spacing in text boxes in recent versions of Access –
> I **think** Access 2002 was the first version to have this feature, though
> I'm not 100% certain of that. Open a form in design view, select a text
> box, and look for a Line Spacing property on the Format tab of the
> Properties window.

> To force a line break, use vbCrLf in code, or Chr\$(13) & Chr\$(10) in SQL
> or expressions. Examples follow ...

>
> In code:
> strSomeTextOnTwoLines = "This is the first line" & vbCrLf & "this is the
> second line"

>
> An expression:
> ="This is the first line" & Chr\$(13) & Chr\$(10) & "this is the second
> line"
