As is evidenced here, much about Refresh is unclear. Per Help in Access 2000:

"The Refresh method immediately updates the records in the underlying record source for a specified form or datasheet *to reflect changes made to the data by you and other users in a multiuser environment.*

The Refresh method shows only changes made to records in the current set. Since the Refresh method doesn't actually query the database, *the current set won't include records that have been added or exclude records that have been deleted since the database was last queried.*"

I take this to mean that Refresh should only be used in a multi-user environment, and that even there it is of limited use. I think in this case that Me.Requery would probably be better than Me.Refresh.
