I have created a file called Security\_Log and a FORM called Security\_Log. I want my security officers to be able to enter data records into the Security\_log file using the Security\_Log Form. Once an officer enters a data record I want him and the other officers to be able to see all the records entered by all the officers. However I DO NOT want any of the officers to be able to change, edit or delete any records not even their own. I as administrator and owner of the file and form will be the only one able to change, modify or delete any and all records. Is this possible and if so how is it done. Please I need help.

I design my user interfaces such that I have a continuous view form that shows a few fields from the form, and put two buttons in the footer of that form, one labeled "Add New Record", the other "View selected record". Both open the same form, but in the first case it tells the form to open in data-entry mode, in the other it opens the form in read-only.

Form is set to hide the navigation buttons so the only way to get to a different record is close the form and reopen.

This allows a user to quickly scan the important details, and drill down when more information is needed..
