Spycatcher  
(<http://www.tenebril.com/>)  
Neither of  
these  
are he lying  
false  
positives  
that plague  
the Internet.  
Both are  
free and  
qworth teh  
try. I helped  
with the  
development  
of  
SpyCatcher,  
but prefer  
SpyBot  
myself :)
