This date is read from the database and displayed in a listview object first, and when the user clicks a button this date is then exported from the database to a csv file, which means I have to intervene twice in vba to format it to ddmmyyyy. I can manage that, but had hoped/expected Access to do that for me.

The date format you display has nothing to do with how the date is actually stored in the database table. Simply format it the way you want it displayed and let Access worry about how it's stored.

Hope that clarifies it for you.

Hi,

I have a datepicker on a form.
The selected date is stored in a table.
The format of that date field is 'short date notation'.

Unfortunately that doesn't work: both date AND time are stored.

I setup the datepicker object with dtpShortDate. This, combined with the field format should yield a date only, no ?
