You can try
NZ(K,"NULL")

....& Me.LOT & "" & ", " & i & ", " & j & ", " & Nz(K,"Null" & ", " &
Nz(K,"Null") & ";"

I think that will concatenate into your statement correctly.

I am using the SQL statement below to insert a record into a table. The statement works fine if K contains a value. (both [ASH VALUE], AND [BULK DENSITY] are double data types.) But I often want to set one or both to empty/null. I seem to be able to do this if i edit the table manually by deleting the entry in those fields but how do I do it with the SQL statement.

Can I "set K to null somehow?

strSQL = "INSERT INTO [LOT QC DATA] " _  
& "([COMPOUND LOT], DRUM, SAMPLE,[ASH VALUE],[BULK DENSITY]) " _  
& "SELECT " _  
& "" & Me.LOT & "" & ", " & i & ", " & j & ", " & K & ", " & K & ";"
```
