Anyway :-), I have a question:

I had a similar experience to that reported here, which I resolved by rolling back the patch, but I was assured that the update was NOT the cause of my problem ("I've been using Excel and Access since the patch, and I've never had any problem, the patch only affects updates from Access, not etc etc"). Since my development machine has so many products installed, un-installed, re-installed, patched, un-patched, re-patched, I was never able to say for sure if I just had installation problems, or what the effect of the patch was on DAO append and update queries.

Is there a consensus opinion on this now?
