"Region = ' ' & [Region] & ' ' "

I copied the basConcatenate function over to my database and in my query I'm using the VBA code:

```
RegionTest: Concatenate("SELECT CongregationName FROM tblCongregation WHERE  
Region = " & [Region])
```

But when I run the query, it comes up with an error for each row:

```
Run-time error '-2147217900 (8004e14)':  
Syntax error (missing operator) in query expression 'Region =North West'.
```

(ie where the row is for the North West region)

What have I done wrong??
