No, you cannot change the default Access login screen that appears with a secured database. This object is not exposed to the developer.

You can, however, make your own custom login form in a second unsecured database. Your users will probably never know the difference. For a detailed walk-through on how to set this up, see my steps in a post from a couple of months ago:
