

RE: How do you use a Security Wizard Report?

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Hi Juliana,

It sounds as if you are not using the correct WorkGroup Information File when opening the database file. Check the Security Wizard Report to see what's the name of the "*.MDW" file.

Once found create a shortcut to open your database file as follows:

```
"C:\ <full path to the file MsAccess.exe>" "<full path to *.MDB file>"  
/wrkgrp "<full path to *.MDW file>"
```
