Mark wrote:

- > *I have a FE/BE database which is built on Access security. On top of*
- > *this, I have also added my own security so that each user (about 50)*
- > *has their own userid. I have disabled the shift key on startup and*
- > *was confident that it was secure. However, I have found that someone*
- > *has been tampering with data which they should not have access to.*
- > *After weeks of trying to figure out how it was done I have found that*
- > *they did it by creating a new database whilst joined to my workgroup*
- > *and then importing all the tables. Because that startup options are*
- > *not set the same as mine, they can open up all of the tables they*
- > *have read access on.*
- >
- > *Is there anyway that I can prevent users*
- > *A) creating a new database whilst joined to my workgroup*
- > *or*
- > *B) Importing tables from my database?*

I don't believe you can prevent them from creating a new database, but you can deny them permission to your tables and use queries set to Run with owner permissions for all data interaction via forms/reports.

Without permission to the tables, they won't be able to import/link.
