

Security in a Terminal Services Environment

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Forgive me if this is an elementary question. I am still very green with Access.

I am trying to implement security (through the built-in Microsoft Access wizard) in a terminal services environment. We currently use 4 separate servers, each having a licensed copy of Access loaded onto it.

I have studied up on the "Microsoft Access Security FAQ" as well as other sources, and feel I have a decent understanding of how security is designed to work. My Groups, Users, etc. have been set up, and permissions assigned.

My problem is this -- each user in our active directory has their own specific default "path" to the workgroup.

I want to be able to implement security across our network (for all Access databases) without having to change each users default "path" in each server.

Is this possible?

I have been reading this forum and keep seeing that in a terminal services environment, every user should have their own copy of the front-end database. I would like to avoid doing this, if possible.
