I'm going to try disabling packet filtering on the ISA server. Our network as I said, is connected to the internet via Broadband. There is a NAT enabled router between the second NIC on the server and the broadband modem. Do you think it would be ok to run with the packet filtering disabled as a full time solution (if this gets ftp of the clients working of course) as the 'firewall' will then be the NAT router?

>server (and autoconfiguration is turned off), and if proxy settings in IE,

>tab Connections, Lan settings, is pointing to your server and port 8080 on

>the workstations, you might want to check the Advanced tab of IE, and make

>sure that http 1.1 over proxy is enabled. There would be no need to change

>the default ISA settings as far as I know.
