- > Read permission & the Modify permission, then he would be able to read files,
- > add files, edit files, and delete files".

- > 1. My understanding is that he should have Modify because he belongs to HR
- > which is assigned Modify also it says he is able to edit files (hence
- > Modify).

- > 2. As for deleting files/ folders within a folder, one needs Read, Read &

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- > Execute and Write permissions in order for Modify to delete files/ folders
 - > within a folder.
 - > If it is only Read & Execute & Write with modify, then he will not be able
 - > to delete files/ folders within the folder. (Not including Full Control just
 - > talking about Modify's power).
