- > of a single Active Directory domain named Certkiller.com. All network servers
- > – Windows Server 2003. Certkiller.com has office in Atlanta, Denver, and
- > Vancouver. Each office has one domain controller. Each office also has its
- > own organization unit (OU), which contains all user accounts and computer
- > accounts in that office.
- > The Denver OU is accidentally deleted from Active Directory. You perform an
- > authoritative restoration of that OU. Some users in Denver now report that
- > they receive the following error message when they try to log on to the
- > domain.
- > "The session setup from the computer DOMAINMEMBER failed to authenticate.
- > The name of the account referenced is the security database in
- > DOMIAINMEMBER\$. The following error occurred: "Access is denied".
- > How should you solve this problem?
- > A. Reset the computer accounts of the computers that receive the error
- > message.
- > Instruct the affected users to restart their computers.
- > B. Perform a nonauthoritative restoration of Active Directory.
- > Force directory replication on all domain controllers.
- > C. Restart the Kerberos Key Distribution Center service on each domain
- > controller.

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- > D. Run Nltest.exe on the computers that receive the error message.
- > Restart the Net Logon service on the domain controller on Denver.
