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As I said, the ability to set this really depends on the Provider. For example, pre-2005 SQL Server did not have snapshot isolation: it was newly introduced in SQL 2005, so the SQLOLEDB provider will not be able to use it, whereas the new SQLNCLI provider should be able to. You need to look for the documentation for that provider to see if it can do it.

Maybe. It depends on what database and provider you are using. It sounds as if you don't have access to the ADO documentation which can be found here:

Look for the Isolationlevel property, as well as the IsolationLevelEnum enumeration.
