It is simple, I have a small client application, windows c# .NET, framework 2.0...

Within mdb are two tables, the first one is approx 300.000 rows, and second one is approx 100 rows. User reads (no update) and search data. Search is normal with WHERE clause based on column value and incremental.

Then the answer is still the same. It is practically impossible to protect a file that anyone has physical access to. If you have control of the box then you can prevent physical access administratively through the operating system. Otherwise, you either accept a certain amount of insecurity, or go to something else. (SQL Express might provide some additional protection. <?>)
