

microsoft.public.development.device.drivers: RE: What version of DDI is Win 2000 really?

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This reflects the type of the driver itself, not the OS you are running it on. So if you had a NT4-style kernel mode printer driver, it would be a "v2" driver. These drivers are installed in the w32x86\2 directory as opposed to the '3' folder. Hence, DDI\_DRIVER\_VERSION\_NT4 is returned in this case. So in your case, I would guess that your driver is an NT4-style driver.
