Hi James,

A guess of the problem would be that the specific problem is that the user account does not have the permissions to write to the registry key or that is used to hold the configuration settings for the sink filter, and/or the file location for the backing files. I would also suspect that this can be worked around by using `IStreamBufferConfigure` and `IStreamBufferInitialize` to explicitly use a registry key that the user account has the permissions to write to, and configuring a backing file directory that the user has permissions to write to.

<http://msdn2.microsoft.com/en-us/library/ms786785.aspx>. In the sample, they used `HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE`, which I would not suspect a regular user account would have rights to write to in Vista.
