The "Practitioners Report" session provides you with an opportunity to present your experiences in applying object-oriented technologies or related software development practices. If you are able to relate your presentation to "theoretical" methods and principles then that is fine, but more importantly, you should present a clear and comprehensible problem, which alternative solutions was considered and eventually selected, advantages and disadvantages of these, and finally lessons learned from this. A concrete example, possibly a small demo, will be useful.
