"cannot debug stored procedures because the SQL Server database is not set up correctly or user does not have permission to execute master.sp_sdidebug. Run SQL server setup or contact database administrator."

I can see the system stored > procedures just fine from a remote machine's SQL enterprise manager, > but when I use the .NET IDE, although I can connect to the local MSDE > databases, I can't see any system stored procedures in master. When I > attempt to debug any SQL, I get the error message:
