No, I mean that you should not confuse virtual directories with file system folders, and make sure that you work on the appropriate folder for what you need, which, in this case, is a file system folder. Also, as I mentioned several messages ago, there are more than one type of permissions on a file system folder. If you go to the Properties dialog of a file system folder, you should see 2 tabs that deal with security. One is the Sharing tab, and the other is the Security tab. The Sharing tab is for managing Share permissions. The Security tab is for managing permissions not for Shares, but for the folder itself. In the Security tab you will also find an Advanced button, which opens up a dialog for checking Security at a deeper level, such as inherited permissions passed down from container folders, etc. That is most probably where your problem lies.
