If you use this product to manage session (the license may be free if you only have one server), you can definitely do this.

It supports in memory session access from within or outside the individual session. You can also share session in memory across servers on a farm and application domains.

It basically gives you way to create a unique key and reference what is stored under that key from any app on any server regardless of application domain.
