Okay, I guess you don't need it :-). With impersonation ASP.NET Web application would access the file system using as the user "myDomain\testuser". Maybe this is the reason of a login prompt. Either remove that section, or set

```
<identity impersonate="false" />
```

Now, try to set

```
<authorization>  
<allow users="*" />  
</authorization>
```

Make sure that your account has access

Set up an access rule for specific group (your user must be a member of that group)

```
<authorization>  
<allow roles="DOMAIN\group" />  
<deny users="*" />  
</authorization>
```

See what happens

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
