That's the idea yes, and we have a pretty frequent publication schedule. Our current source control system only allows 20 users, and all users have full read and write rights, so it's just not an option to allow everyone direct access to it. We also find it would generate more "support" requests, as many users expect all pieces of a download to just work. If you have a specific library you want to work on, you can always apply for membership in the workspace. We have never rejected anyone who specifically requested it because they had something to contribute. So if you want to work on the library and publish fixes and work back to the source repository, we've got a mechanism for that to happen. If you'd like to know more, just email us.
