- > You can add accessor get/set on generated file but it's not a good idea
- > because you should do the job each time your WSDL will change !

After the initial prototyping, however, WSDL shouldn't be changing very often. Personally I think it's much nicer to have a well-written web service data class which uses the normal .NET naming conventions, properties etc.
