I used the conversion wizard on a smaller project than what you have listed 15-20 forms and maybe 2 dozen classes.

The upgrade was a slow and painful process. It takes a lot of patience and mental toughness ;-)

I don't know that I would rely on the wizard handling your ado connections, recordsets, etc...

It's something you may have to go through after the upgrade.

I've only done this once, and we were using DAO.
