I thank you for your reply but it was a bit too cryptic for me.

Can you enlarge on what you are illustrating please?

In my specific situation, as I have already successfully extracted all entries for a particular street from the main database, the alpha text in each case is identical, and only the numeric portion is different.

So I have the first entry as 1 Foo St and the second entry is 1007 Foo St and many more entries before coming to 2 Foo St.

I hope this clarifies my situation and problem.
