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I appreciate you responding but while know and understand that control 1 is a mini-shortcut to the format cells overall box, I am looking for the icon that is one step, i.e. like the "comma" symbol on the little icon/toolbar command that makes the numer in the cell a "1,2345.67" format versus a 12345.67" format a 1-step process. The older version of Excel had the icon/toolbar command for giving a user-defined default cell pattern background but I can not find it on the 2007 version. Thanks again.
