The number of rows varies, but it is typically about 600 rows of data. This data begins on row 9. Row 8 contains the column headers and the 1st 7 rows contain junk that comes over from the program I download this data from. It can be eliminated if it helps.

Basically I am looking for a macro that steps through each row of data and if the sum of column C through column AE = zero, I would like the entire row to be deleted.

Does anybody have any ideas? I feel bad because this is the third time I have come to this group for help. Each time the solutions have been terrific. I keep hoping I can answer a question instead of always asking, but so far all the questions asked have been above my skill level.
