Eg:

```
Application.FindFormat.Clear  
With Application.FindFormat.Interior  
.ColorIndex = 6  
.Pattern = xlSolid  
.PatternColorIndex = xlAutomatic  
End With
```

I have a problem when trying to use the range.replace method in excel. If I have left the find/replace environment in "within" "Workbook" mode and run my VBA code. The routine will update the entire workbook instead of the selected range as I would expect.

Is there a way in VBA to reset the "within" setting to "sheet" prior to executing the Replace method?

Also, can anyone give a quick explanation to SearchFormat & ReplaceFormat parameters to this function. I can only find examples where they are set to

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false. And the Microsoft documentation is not very helpful.
