in the

> left pane.

> 3. Right-click Recipient Policies, and then click New Recipient  
Policy on

> the shortcut menu.

>

> 4. In the Name box, type a name for the recipient policy.

>

> 5. Click Modify. The Find Exchange Recipients dialog box appears.  
In the

> Find Exchange Recipients dialog box, you can create a filter for  
users to

> which the recipient policy will apply.

> 5. Click the "E-Mail Addresses" tab, and then add any additional  
Simple  
> Mail Transfer Protocol (SMTP) addresses (domain2.net) that you want  
the  
> Exchange-based computer to host. You can set the new domain to  
primary.
