> this might have been the problem)*

> *We've used the various tools to copy the user accounts onto Domain_New
> (ADMT) and the exchange Migration tool to copy over the User account
> links in exchange.*

> *But when the user tries to open outlook it prompts them to enter their
> Domain_Old logon details. Within the Exchange Admin program (in the
> users mailbox) I've tried manually selecting the users account from
> the Domain_New but when I click on 'Apply' it comes up with the
> following error message and then changes the account to 'Account
> Unknown'.*

> *No mapping between account names and Security IDs was done*
