> *We have an Exchange 2003 server behind NAT router. I want one MAPI client*
> *from DMZ zone to acces the exchange server (since SQL mailing client*
> *requires a MAPI profile to send the e-mails).*

> *I searched the net for the ports I need to open/forward so the MAPI*
> *connection could be established. I tried the MS Article ID:155831, but the*
> *registry keys they are talking about doesn't exist. Probalby the article is*
> *about the 2000 exchange.*
>
> *Then I opened for the port 135 and now it points to the exchange server, so*
> *clients from DMZ zone can access directly the exchange server establishing*
> *connections on port 135. But that doesn't work – when I try to make a*
> *profile in Outlook on the computer in DMZ, it says that it cannot find the*
> *server.*
>
> *What port should I open on my NAT router so Outlook XP (2002) and higher*
> *clients could access the exhchange 2003 server, having the full*
> *functionality...?*
