"Bharat Suneja [MVP]" wrote:

No... not necessarily Front-Ends. FEs, if they're running SMTP, may or may not receive SMTP mail.

Inbound SMTP mail is received by the server(s) that the MX record(s) in your external DNS zone point to. If these are your FEs, they should receive inbound internet mail and can be said to be your gateway servers. Else, the MX could point to Bridgehead servers (SMTP virtual servers that serve as Bridgeheads for Connectors), mailbox servers, or non-Exchange SMTP hosts which in turn forward the inbound mail to Exchange server(s).

Did you ever install IMF v1? If yes, uninstall it first. Not sure if it's installed? Check \exchsrvr\bin folder – do you see MSCFV1 folder in it? If yes, you still have IMFv1 installed. If you don't see it in Add/Remove Programs, you will need to reinstall IMFv1, then uninstall it, and apply Exchange Server 2003 SP2 which includes IMF v2.
