1. All but one user listed in mailboxes_1.txt is listed as Central...the other is listed as Eastern
2. A LOT of users are listed in nonexistent.txt but I understand this can happen if they don't have appointments which is a possibility for a lot of these users since they are mainly on the phones all day.
3. One user for sure is not listed in ANY of the txt files.
4. I have two users listed over there as conflicting TZ. (CST and EST)

The tool picks up the mailbox time zones from the following: 1) Recurring meetings. If not determined, it looks at MAPI properties on the mailbox for: 2) Outlook time zone 3) OWA time zone 4) CDO time zone. If these conflict, the user will be logged in the conflict log.
