If you are using Exchange 2003 then the administrator account by default is denied access to mailboxes. However you can create any other user account admin or no and then adding the account to the ACL for a mailbox in ADUC by going into the Exchange Advanced tab, mailbox rights and selecting full control.

You can always remove the domain admin group from the membership in their user accounts. If they complain that they cannot install software you can give them local Admin on their PC.

If you remove the domain admin group from their user account then they will not be able to add their account to the mailbox rights in ADUC.

Make sure you change the administrator password as well in case they no this.
