What's the reason you can't use OWA? Supporting 1000 POP users sounds like a pain – OWA with SSL will let them change their own passwords.

> *services like group calendaring that you get with exchange.*

> *What I ideally require is for the ability for people to have a mailbox*  
> *on exchange and use normal OUTLOOK, and have the mail for that mailbox*  
> *downloaded via POP3. This of course will be unique to each user, and*  
> *the user needs somehow to either change or be asked each time for a*  
> *password to take away the ADMINs changing 1000 passwords !*
