

Re: Groupwise connector error

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Here's a suggestion that has worked:

- Uninstall the "Client for Netware Services (CSNW)"/GroupWise Services for NetWare (GSNW) for Windows 2000 or 2003
- Install the 32bit Novell Client on the Windows 2000 or 2003 from the Novell Web site.

Note: Keep in mind that the 32bit Novell Client is NOT the same as the GroupWise Client.

- Make sure you can map to the API folders from the Exchange server to the GroupWise server.
- Load the API Gateway Service in GroupWise
- Start the Connectivity Controller, Connector for Novell GroupWise and Novell GroupWise Router services on Exchange 2003

> *We are migrating from Groupwise 6 to Exchange 2003 and I*

> for the most part seem to have everything ironed out with
> the API and using the Migration Wizard to move mail (we
> don't use the calendar functionality that much in GW). I
> have containers setup for migrated users in AD (we have a
> fully functional 2003 AD structure setup) and it seems
> everything is working properly except for one thing. I
> have tested the API per the documentation in the 2003
> interoperability doc and it does seem to work BUT I get
> an error in my Exchange Server application log regarding
> the Connector for Groupwise. It's Event ID 6061 and the
> entry looks like this: "The following directory could
> not be found:
> \\groupwiseserver\apps\v_domain\wpgate\api\API_OUT.
> Please make sure the directory setting is correct and the
> Groupwise Server is running. The system error code is
> 1317. The specified user does not exist." Now I assume
> this error is referring to the user in the connector
> settings on the Exchange Server (Netware Account in the
> settings). I have tried my migration account and a
> couple other admin accounts with rights in both locations
> (including leading periods) to no avail. I continually
> get this error message. I have CSNW installed on the
> Exchange Server and I'm able to map the above path (the
> path specified in the connector as well
> \\groupwiseserver\apps\v_domain\wpgate\api) and create
> and modify folders and text files in these directories
> from the Exchange Server. I even see the test emails I
> sent sitting in the API_OUT and the ATT_OUT directories.
> I am going nuts trying to figure out what I need to do to
> make the connector happy. Any suggestions are GREATLY
> appreciated. Thanks!
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
