> We currently have a Exchange 2k3 environment with 2 servers that works  
> great.  
> Right now when remote users need to access their mail they use web mail  
> with  
> ssl or they use a vpn connection. So these connections are secure. We  
> have  
> a situation where we may have to setup IMAP and SMTP for remote users  
> like  
> with Outlook Express. I have configured and tested IMAP using an >  
> off-site  
> computer and using Outlook Express. I secured it by selecting > "Requires  
> ssl/tls encryption" for authentication and "Require a secure channel"  
> under  
> secure communication. We use in-house certificates. This works fine.  
> My problem is with the SMTP part. How can I set it up so that remote  
> users  
> can authenticate securely to relay mail but remote smtp servers trying > to  
> send mail to my servers can continue to work as well? Under > "connection  
> control" we have ip addresses and subnets listed to control who can >  
> access  
> this smtp virtual server. This is setup so that only our in house > subnets  
> and our spam filter company can send access the default smtp virtual  
> server.  
> Any help will be appreciated. Can this be done? Sorry for tmi.
