Problem #1: user is sending an email addressed to both external users and internal users. Internal users need to see the custom user properties (need to send using custom form), while external users cannot have winmail.dat attached (must use plain text). ... headache

> better approach would be to set the recipient address flag to be in plain
> text and not RTF.
