> > Should be a fairly straight forward procedure.

> > Do it on a weekend, or after hours obviously.

> > If you are on a routed network, investigate whether any routers maintain

> > static routes.

> > If you are running a firewall, or ISA on the perimeter, investigate the

> > rules and update accordingly.

> > Make sure all DCs, servers, and clients use a common DNS server.

> > Change the DCs first.

> > After the IP is changed, the DC will register its A record in DNS

> > automatically.

> > I don't like to depend on this though. run ipconfig /registerdns

> > You should then cycle the netlogon service to reregister the SRV

records.

> > force synch or DNS zone if you have any secondary zones configured.

> > After all DCs are changed, run dcdiag and netdiag on all DCs.

> > Provided all is clean, proceed with the member servers.

> > run netdiag on the members after that.

> > Provided all is good, then proceed with the DHCP config for your client

> > base.
