> > As soon as I do this, I get a "Page cannot not be displayed" window

> > and at the bottom it says "Cannot find server of dns error".

> > If I go to a command prompt, I can telnet in to my Exchange server on

> > port 443 although the telnet window is blank once I am in.

> > Am I overlooking something simple here? SSL 128 bit is enabled in the

> > properties of the default web site. I have done this whole

> > procedure many times with Windows 2000 Server and Exchange 2000.
