> *You might want to make sure you have a reverse PTR Record for your domain.*

> *Also make sure you are not blacklisted for some reason.*

> *You can do all this at www.Dnsstuff.com*

> *One other thing, on the properties of your smtp virtual*

> *server\Delivery\Advanced\DNS suffix... make sure that you have a domain*

> *name in there that can be tracked back to your domain from the Internet.*

> *Like <your domain.com>*

> *A lot of times I see people put <Servername.local> as the address. When
you*

> *connect to some remote systems with this name, they can not track it back*

> *to a valid address\domain because it is not listed on the Intenet. Thus*

> *causing your system to fail to connect to remote systems.*
