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if you use sourcesafe for vb now and it works for you, then foxpro will be the same. as long as you delete the copies that are checked out after you're done editing.

actually i never thought of using it like that. i never leave source code on a clients machine. i used to. now i remote control back to my office, do my edits, then recompile and grab back the executable. my office is always the master copy.

usually its the other way around. i hardly go out into the field except for meetings. i usually do my changes in the office, grab client data if i need to, then recompile and upload an executable.
