| Thanks for the reply.

| I couldn't open the empty site with FP, and I've now copied the entire site
| across with FTP and I still can't open it. I've tried the Recalculate
| Hyperlinks function, but I still have the same problem, in that I can't
| login (when I enter my username and password and click OK, the login screen
| just reappears as if the username/password are wrong).

| FP cites the following as possible reasons:

- | 1. The web server may not have the FrontPage Server Extensions installed.
- | 2. The web server may be temporarily out of service
- | 3. If you are connecting through a proxy server, the proxy settings may be
| incorrect
- | 4. An error may have occurred in the web server

| In response to this

- | 1. They are, I've checked, and verified them again
- | 2. It isn't, FTP works fine
- | 3. I don't use a proxy
- | 4. Who knows! I'll check with the web space provider
