I know very little about Windows 2003 or SBS, and nothing about ISA, so I am not the person to continue this with. Old posts (many months ago) in these FrontPage groups suggest that ISA is a fickle beast, in that some users have no problems and others have to turn it off to enable FrontPage

The authorisation method is a setting in the IIS property sheets, so it will be the host that makes the change.

> one workstation as a secure NAT client and giving that a try. I followed
> his instructions but haven't had any luck getting things to work with the
> problem site. I guess the bright side is it didn't affect the site that I
> have been able to publish to! Am I correct in thinking that the Web Host
> will have to make that change? I don't believe that I've seen anything
> like that in the FrontPage server extension Administration pages.

>>> have some .asp pages (they are form pages that gather data to post in a
>>> database) that load and I'm able to Open the FrontPage Server extension
>>> administrator pages..(I have them bookmarked in my browser.) At times
>>> even the FP extension pages seem like they don't respond to requests
>>> like they did when my LAN was Per to Per. If I bypass the Windows Server
>>> and connect directly to my router things work fine. I can open the live
>>> copy of the web with FrontPage and I can push a local copy of a file to
>>> the web server OK. With those symptoms it would point directly to the
>>> Windows Small Business Server but I manage another FrontPage web site
>>> that is hosted by the same company and I can connect to it just fine
>>> (the same way I'm trying to do with the teelcountry.com web). I've been
>>> gleaning the web for any answers that I can find and it seems like an
>>> unusual problem since it is not consistent as far as just not working at
>>> all, be it through the Small Business Server or bypassing the SBS and
>>> dialing in!! But hopefully we can find something to get this resolved.
>>> If you question anything else let me know. I've typed so many things in
>>> user groups that I can't remember what I've said where.

>>>> running. FP extensions only come into play when some server side
>>>> activity is required - form processing, hit counter, publishing,
>>>> opening a web in FrontPage, etc. - displaying a page does not require
>>>> the extensions unless it contains an active, browsetime component.

>>>> If you give a URL to the web, it can be checked to see if the
>>>> extensions are installed, and if the problem with logging on is limited
>>>> to you or your network.
