> *What am I missing here? I've been digging through Technet and going through newsgroups and such trying to figure this out, and finding a lot of stuff, but never getting to the answer. The two instances above are streamlined down to the essentials; this has been over a week of work and still no success in having a working site. I don't recall my IIS 4.0 and 5.0 sites being difficult to get going at all.*

With Win2K3 and IIS6, in addition to installing and configuring the sites, and giving them their own application pool, you have to look in that third folder under your IIS server (in the IIS Manager console).

Double click that folder and look at the list of extensions that are allowed in the left hand pane. From your description, I would guess that FPSE, FPSE2K2 are there and allowed, but that the Internet Service is not. You have to install this as a component of IIS, and it is not installed by default.

"By default, Windows 2003 Server does not install the indexing server. You should actually see an option in the IIS console to "allow" or "prohibit" the indexing service under the Web Service Extension section.

The solution:

- 1) Go to "add/remove components" – "Windows Components" and uncheck the indexing service so it can be uninstalled.
- 2) Reboot the system
- 3) Go back to "add/remove components" and reinstall the indexing service.
- 4) In the IIS console, under "Web Service Extension", "allow" the indexing service.

5) Recalculate the website

The search should function properly!"
