>> *I'm on a server which supports FRONT PAGE EXTENSIONS, but does NOT support*
>> *ASP (as explained to me earlier, this probably means it's a non-Windows based*
>> *server).*
>>
>> *The server documentation goes into detail listing the FrontPage capabilities*
>> *it supports (including form information to email and form information to db),*
>> *but doesn't explain that without ASP capabilities (FrontPage's native data*
>> *capture language), you'll need to use data capture methods they DO support*
>> *(PHP, mySQL).*
>>
>> *Basically, I can create the forms in FrontPage, but anyone attempting to*
>> *submit (post) data through these forms gets an error message. (A non-ASP*
>> *server will not even accomodate an Access database.)*

>> *Not being familiar with PHP or mySQL, I'm looking for a way to capture the*
>> *data submitted on a FrontPage form and send it to email, db, or both.*
